Mr. Dandridge joined Aurora's Board of Directors in 2014.

Mr. Dandridge, who retired as executive vice president for Northrop Grumman's Integrated Systems in 2007, has nearly four decades of management experience in the defense industry.

Following his seven years in the U.S. Navy, Mr. Dandridge worked at Northrop Grumman focusing on technical pursuits, then contract management, with a transition to Program Management in the early 80's. In 1986 after completing the MIT Sloan Program for Senior Executives under corporate sponsorship, Mr. Dandridge managed the Grumman ten billion dollar Joint Surveillance Target Attack System (Joint STARS) U.S. Air Force program.

In 1994, after the Grumman merger with Northrop, he became sector vice president and general manager of the Surveillance and Battle Management Systems (SBMS) business unit, which combined the Space and Electronic Warfare Systems (SEWS) in Bethpage, New York with the Melbourne operation. The Joint STARS, E-2C, EA-6B and space programs were all managed within SBMS. Mr. Dandridge served as executive vice president for Northrop Grumman Integrated Systems until his retirement.

Mr. Dandridge earned his Bachelors of Science degree from C.W. Post College of the Long Island University. Mr. Dandridge served on the Board of Trustees at Florida Institute of Technology and The Astronauts Memorial Foundation.
